Due to our financial position I have spoken with our union partners to inform them that I want to revisit our collective agreement to increase pay this year. Council's new collective employment agreement came into effect on 23 March 2020 and this included eligible employees receiving a minimum 1.5% pay increase (until the cap of 105% position in range is reached) at 1 July 2020. Given the current crisis and the impacts of this on our organisation, and our communities, we are discussing with the unions our

desire to seek a variation to the remuneration provisions in the collective agreement, to the effect that there would be no wage or salary movements in July this year for all staff. This pay freeze would save \$1 million and safeguard 15 jobs.

Temporary voluntary decrease in pay

During our discussions about COVID-19 and Hutt City Council's response to it, at the Council meeting on Tuesday 24 March you offered to temporarily reduce your salary by 10 per cent, and requested this be reprioritised to fund local food banks and food based charities.

This letter confirms that Council has gratefully accepted your offer. Effective from 6 April 2020 until 30 June 2021, the sacrificed amount of \$37,378 per annum (pro-rated for the period 6 April 2020 to 30 June 2020) will be used to fund contributions to the local food banks and food based charities.

For this agreed period your pay will be \$336,408 per annum, excluding KiwiSaver.

Jo, I'd like to personally thank you for this meaningful gesture of leadership during this time of social and economic uncertainty in our community. I would like to emphasise how much elected members appreciate this.

I'm looking forward to continuing our work together to make our city a place where all of our people thrive – and working to support local people and businesses through the challenges resulting from COVID-19.

Kia ora koutou,

I want to give you a heads up that I will be shortly announcing that I will be taking a 10% pay cut to my Mayoral Salary for 12 months.

I know this issue was discussed a couple of weeks ago (councillors only session), and I had suggested we pool together any amount we would cut. After speaking with most Councillors on this, it became quite clear that it would be very difficult in practice to do this.

I've come to the conclusion that this does need to be done on a case by case basis - and it really is up to each individual elected member. I also acknowledge that I am in the fortunate position of being paid significantly more. If asked publicly about other elected members doing the same, this will be my position.

This has also been discussed with other Mayor's in the region who have taken or are taking similar steps.

In practice since we are unable to cut our own salary (remuneration authority set this), I will be donating the 10% amount to local charities/community organisations.

I want to reiterate that there is no expectation for Councillors or Community Board members to do the same as we all have different circumstances.

- The finances of many households in the city are taking a huge knock, with many people out of work, or on 80% of their usual wages at best. The Council's own revenue will take a hit. Do we follow Jo's lead and volunteer a 10% remuneration cut ourselves for a period?
- Though we all feel desperately sorry for anyone no longer able to work because of this crisis, we are guardians of ratepayers' money. Some of our staff simply can't work from home. Have they been re-deployed? What is the leave accrual situation council-wide? Perhaps these are solely operational matters, in Jo's control only, but should we be seeking an update from her?
