My apologies for this very late email to you all. I had assumed that I had sent an email out to you all early last week to provide you with an update on our engagement plan. However, I have just found the email in my outbox and assume that the email did not get sent due to some system issues we experienced last week.

Kaimahi from Te Rūnanganui o Te Ati Awa and Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira commenced engagement with the neighbourhood regarding Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka with a mail drop on Monday morning (4 Oct 2021).

Please see attached, the letter and fact sheet that went out in the mail drop to approx. 160 homes that are within the closest proximity to the proposed whare.

Our intention is to be available for the next 4 weeks (until Monday 1 November) to hold kanohi ki te kanohi hui with any of the neighbours who are interested in having a korero with us.

Kia ora koutou,

Firstly, on behalf of Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira, I would like to extend our warm thanks and gratitude to you for supporting us and Te Rūnanganui o Te Ati Awa in our transitional housing kaupapa, to awhi and tautoko tane Māori on their release from correctional facilities through our Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka programme.

Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka will look to establish our transitional housing and 24/7 wrap-around support service in the Naenae community.

The kaupapa is very closely aligned to both rūnanga strategic objectives to support and enable positive whānau health and wellbeing and we are excited with the prospects of being able to deliver a meaningul and important service to our tane and their whānau who need it.

Due to the recent COVID-19 outbreak in Aotearoa, we have had to delay our kanohi ki te kanohi (face to face) engagement with the neighbours where we will look to establish transitional housing for Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka.

Meeting with the neighbours is very important to us so we are currently in the process of readjusting and updating our approach to ensure that we have meaningful korero but we are also able to meet the health and safety requirements of Alert Level 2.

We had hoped that updating our plans would be much quicker, however due to the redeployment of all kaimahi across both rūnanga to support the COVID-19 response effort in our communities, we have only just commenced updating our plans.

We expect to have an updated approach next week with the intention to commence engagement from 20th September. We are planning to offer neighbours the ability to korero to us directly via online means, as an alternative to kanohi ki te kanohi, as well as investigating how and where we can continue to offer kanohi ki te kanohi korero for those who would prefer this approach.

ABOUT TE WHARE WHAKARURUHAU O RAUMANUKA

Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is committed to fostering positive transformational change and empowering tane Māori to be rangatira for their whānau, hapū and iwi.

Using a kaupapa Māori, tikanga-led framework, our mahi recognises that all tane Māori are vital and integral members of their whānau, with significant and meaningful contributions to make.

As a service for tane Māori who have been released from corrections facilities or are serving community-based sentences, Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka will provide a safe environment that aims to tautoko, awhi and manaaki tane in their journey of reconnection. Most, if not all tane will be from the Wellington region and may whakapapa to Ngāti Toa Rangatira or Te Ati Awa.

Ngāti Toa Rangatira and Te Ati Awa hold long and wide-reaching aspirations for the health, wellbeing and prosperity for our whānau, delivered through a Te Ao Māori lens.

Together, and working in partnership with Ara Poutama Aotearoa (the Department of Corrections) our collective iwi will provide Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumunuka, an iwi-led service that provides transitional housing, 24/7 wrap around support and access to kaupapa Māori health, social, education, employment and cultural services for up to 18 months.

Without a service like this, many of the men who might live at the property would end up living somewhere else in the Naenae community or wider Wellington region without the wrap-around support that they need. Some of them may end up homeless or in unsuitable accommodation, which can lead to reoffending.

Public safety is our top priority

- Residents will undergo a robust assessment and selection process
- A person will not be permitted to reside at the property if we think the risk to public safety could not be safely managed
- Our experienced kaimahi will provide 24-7 onsite wrap around support for residents, with at least two staff members at all times
- We will install outdoor CCTV cameras to monitor activities at the properties
- Men with convictions for sexually offending against adults and children will not be permitted to live at the properties
- Residents will agree to the tikanga and kawa while living at the property, including a ban on alcohol and drugs and requiring approval for any manuhiri

- Residents will be required to demonstrate that they are making efforts to distance themselves from any gang connections and will not be permitted to wear or display gang regalia on the property
- Residents will be subject to the conditions of their sentence or order.

We want to give you the opportunity to korero to us

As mana whenua of the Wellington region and part of the Naenae community, we are committed to delivering this community-based and iwi-led service.

We have carried out our due dilligence and we are confident that the support that we are able to provide will be of benefit to the entire community.

To further strengthen our mahi, ensure the success of the kaupapa and maintain the safety of our community, we want to understand the needs, aspirations, concerns and challenges for our neighbours.

We welcome the opportunity to kōrero to you, to ensure that you and your whānau are included in the development of our proposal, the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa and address any concerns that you may have.

Representatives from our iwi and our service will be available to meet with individuals or whānau at your whare or at an alternative location from Monday 4 October 2021 to Monday 1 November 2021. They will be available during weekdays from 9.30am – 5pm, with extended availability on Tuesday and Thursday evenings until 7pm throughout this four week period.

Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is a community-based, iwi led transitional housing service to support tane Māori who have been released from a corrections facility, or given a comminunity-based service with support to reconnect with their whānau and the community.

Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is a programme delivered by Te Rūnanganui o Te Ati Awa and Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira, with the support of Ara Poutama Aotearoa.

About Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka

Who is the service for?

The service will be for tane who are motivated and committed to successfully transition into living in the Wellington region and who need the wraparound support that the service can provide.

They will whakapapa to or have close whānau ties with Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa and are committed to maintaining the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa.

Is this a prison or corrections facility? No, Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is not a prison or a corrections facility. It is a kaupapa Māori supported accommodation that provides wrap around support and navigational services.

Only people serving community sentences and orders will live in our whare. Residents will be expected to maintain a strong commitment to the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa.

How long will residents live at the service?

Most residents will live at the service between six to twelve months, but some may stay for up to eighteen months if they need further support to reconnect with their whānau and the community. Residents will be supported to move out earlier if they are ready and have found suitable long-term accommodation.

They will continue to receive support after they have moved out, as they transition to life in the community.

How will the residents be selected?

If someone is interested in living in the whare, they will be part of a careful and robust assessment and selection process.

In assessing their suitability, our service will carefully consider:

- Their motivation to rehabilitate to a crime-free life
- Any rehabilitation programmes they have undertaken
- Whether they will get on with other residents in the service
- Whānau connections in the area
- Any risk to public safety or victims
- Their demonstrated motivation to distance themselves from any gang connections.

Will there be any rules and regulations within the whare?

All residents will need to agree to the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa. Our tikanga and kawa will be firm but fair, to ensure the safety of all our residents, kaimahi and the community.

Our kawa will include a curfew, clear times for manuhiri and a ban on drugs and alcohol.

Additional to our tikanga and kawa, residents will also need to comply with any conditions they have on their sentence and orders.

The residents must demonstrate motivation to be accepted into the service, and this includes distancing themselves from gang members. Gang regalia will not be permitted in the property or worn by residents or manuhiri.



Our priority is to ensure community safety

How will we keep the community safe?

The safety of the community is our top priority.

A person will not be permitted to reside at the whare if we think the risk to public safety could not be safely managed.

Our kaimahi will provide 24-7 onsite wrap-around support for residents, with at least two staff members awake at all times in 28A-28E Treadwell Street and two covering both 24 and 26 Rata Street.

We will install outdoor CCTV cameras to monitor activities on each property.

Residents will be selected through a careful and robust assessment and selection process and must be committed and motivated to futurefocused transformational change and leading healthy, safe and resilient lives.

Men with current or historic convictions for sexual offending against children or adults will not be eligible for the service.

Residents must commit to living by the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa and Ara Poutama Aotearoa and the New Zealand Police will be responsible for any enforcement action taken if residents place themselves, other residents, our kaimahi or the community at risk.

Ara Poutama Aotearoa and Police will act swiftly to address any actions by residents that place themselves, our kaimahi or the public at risk, or breach any parole or sentencing requirements. Unsafe or antisocial behaviour will not be tolerated and could lead to being withdrawn from the whare and facing enforcement action before a court or the New Zealand Parole Board.

Will men with high or complex needs be eligible to live at the service?

No, men with high or complex needs will not be eligible.

This includes men who:

- Present as being at high risk of harm to others
- Have a high risk of serious reoffending, such as highly violent or sexual offending
- Have serious addiction or substance abuse issues
- Have acute mental illness
- Have cognitive impairments.

Men with historic convicitions for sexually offending against adults and children will not be permitted to live at the service.

Can the community provide feedback?

Āe, we welcome feedback and input from the wider community to provide feedback to assist in the development of our tikanga and kawa.

As mana whenua in the region, Te Ati Awa and Ngāti Toa Rangatira are committed to delivering this service and ensuring that the tikanga and kawa of our service is maintained at all times.

As a service for tane Māori who have been released from corrections facilities or are serving community-based sentences, Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka will provide a safe environment that aims to tautoko, awhi and manaaki tane in their journey of reconnection. Most, if not all tane will be from the Wellington region and may whakapapa to Ngāti Toa Rangatira or Te Ati Awa.

Ngāti Toa Rangatira and Te Ati Awa hold long and wide-reaching aspirations for the health, wellbeing and prosperity for our whānau, delivered through a Te Ao Māori lens.

Together, and working in partnership with Ara Poutama Aotearoa (the Department of Corrections) our collective iwi will provide Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumunuka, an iwi-led service that provides transitional housing, 24/7 wrap around support and access to kaupapa Māori health, social, education, employment and cultural services for up to 18 months.

Without a service like this, many of the men who might live at the property would end up living somewhere else in the Naenae community or wider Wellington region without the wrap-around support that they need. Some of them may end up homeless or in unsuitable accommodation, which can lead to reoffending.

Public safety is our top priority

- Residents will undergo a robust assessment and selection process
- A person will not be permitted to reside at the property if we think the risk to public safety
- Our experienced kaimahi will provide 24-7 onsite wrap around support for residents, with at
- least two staff members at all times
- We will install outdoor CCTV cameras to monitor activities at the properties Men with convictions for sexually offending against adults and children will not be permitted
- Residents will agree to the tikanga and kawa while living at the property, including a ban on
- alcohol and drugs and requiring approval for any manuhiri

- Residents will be required to demonstrate that they are making efforts to distance themselves from any gang connections and will not be permitted to wear or display gang regalia on the property
- Residents will be subject to the conditions of their sentence or order.

As mana whenua of the Wellington region and part of the Naenae community, we are committed to delivering this community-based and iwi-led service.

We have carried out our due dilligence and we are confident that the support that we are able to provide will be of benefit to the entire community.

To further strengthen our mahi, ensure the success of the kaupapa and maintain the safety of our community, we want to understand the needs, aspirations, concerns and challenges for our neighbours.

We welcome the opportunity to korero to you, to ensure that you and your whanau are included in the development of our proposal, the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa and address any concerns that you may have.

Representatives from our iwi and our service will be available to meet with individuals or whānau at your whare or at an alternative location from Monday 4 October 2021 to Monday 1 November 2021. They will be available during weekdays from 9.30am – 5pm, with extended availability on Tuesday and Thursday evenings until 7pm throughout this four week period.

The document provides key messages and frequently asked questions to support the community engagement activity for this service. This document will continually be updated as required with more details as new messages are developed.

Frequently asked questions

1. Service

What do we want to do?

We want to establish a kaupapa Māori transitional housing service at 28A-28E Treadwell Street and 24 and 26 Rata Street, Naenae for up to twenty six men who will receive 24-7 on-site wrap-around support to help them transition to independent living in the Hutt Valley and Wellington region. The service will be delivered by a new Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa service provider. Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa will designed the service, working closely with Corrections.

Why are we doing this and what are the benefits to the community?

There is a significant need for supported housing in the Wellington region for men being released from a corrections facility or needing suitable accommodation to serve a community-based sentences. Around 150 men were released from a corrections facility to the Wellington Region between December 2020 and June 2021. Of those around 80 identified an accommodation need.

Without a service like this, many of the men who might live at the service would end up living in the Hutt Valley and Wellington region without the wrap-around support that this service will offer. Some of them may end up homeless or in unsuitable accommodation, which can lead to reoffending.

We know that if we provide residents with a kaupapa Māori service that provides 24-7 support around employment, education, training, and life skills, they will be more successful transitioning back into community life. This service will provide the much-needed foundation for residents to reintegrate into the Wellington community.

How will we support residents?

Staff will provide 24-7 wrap-around support and navigational services to each resident to help them to successfully reintegrate into the community. Staff will work with probation officers and other Community Corrections staff, local social service providers, Work and Income and other agencies to support to residents to:







- Find employment
- Ensure they have the clothing, equipment, and transport options to remain employed
- Pursue further training and education
- Address health needs
- Develop life skills, such as parenting, budgeting, managing a household or getting a licence
- Build connections with whanau and the wider community
- Strengthen connections to whakapapa and te ao Māori
- Find suitable long-term accommodation in the Hutt Valley.

Is this a prison or a corrections facility?

No, this is not a prison or a corrections facility. This will be a kaupapa Māori supported accommodation service.

Only people serving community sentences and orders will live there. The residents will not be detained by Corrections or staff and will be free to come and go, within the restrictions of the house rules and any conditions on their sentences or orders.

How long will residents live at the service?

Most residents will live at the service between six to twelve months, but some may stay for up to eighteen months if they need further support to reintegrate into the community. Residents will be supported to move out earlier if they are ready and have found suitable long-term accommodation. They will continue to receive support after they have moved out, as they transition to life in the community.

Will residents choose to live there?

Residents will be self-motivated to live at the service and will have to undertake a careful and robust assessment and selection process. The service will be opt-in and a resident will not be ordered to live there by the judiciary.







How will we manage visitors?

Visitors must be pre-approved and will have to apply to visit. They will only be able to visit at prearranged set times and must comply with the house rules while at the property. If visitors do not follow the house rules, it may result in them being banned from the property. Gang regalia will not be permitted to be worn by visitors.

How will this address regional homelessness?

All residents will have an identified housing need. Without this service, some of the residents could find themselves homeless or in unsuitable accommodation, without any support. This creates conditions that can lead to reoffending.

2. Residents

Who will the residents be?

The service will be for men who are motivated to successfully transition into living in the Wellington region and who need the wrap-around support that the service will provide. They will whakapapa to or have close whānau ties with Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa, who are mana whenua in the area. They will have opted in to live at the service and will be committed to being employed, furthering their education or in training while living there.

Where will the residents be from?

Most will be from the Wellington region and all will have either close whānau ties with Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa, who are mana whenua in the area. All residents will be committed to living in the region long-term.

How will we select the residents?

If someone is interested in living at the service, they will have to undertake a careful and robust assessment and selection process.

For residents released from a corrections facility, their case manager will work closely with them and iwi staff to determine if they are suitable. This way staff will be certain that the resident will be a good fit and ensures that, when the resident is released to live at the service from a facility, they already have a positive relationship with some of the support staff.





Some residents will be sent to live at the service by a Court as part a community-based sentence. For a resident to be referred to live at the service by a Court, they must first have opted in by expressing their interest to their probation officer. The probation officer will work with the potential resident and the service provider to assess if they would be suitable and, if they are, they will recommend this to the Court, which makes the final decision.

In assessing their suitability, the case manager or probation officer will consider:

- Their motivation to rehabilitate to a crime-free life
- Any rehabilitation programmes they have undertaken
- Whether they will get on with other residents in the service
- Whanau connections in the area
- Any risk to public safety or victims
- Their demonstrated motivation to distance themselves from any gang connections

If they are being released from a corrections facility, their case manager will also consider their individual reintegration needs assessment plan.

If they are being sent to live at the service by a Court as part a community-based sentence, their probation officer will also consider whether they are employed and if the location of the service is close to their job, programmes, counselling services and whānau.

What will typical daily life look like for residents?

The service will operate like a supported flatting environment. Residents will be responsible for daily shared living activities, such as cooking, shopping for groceries, washing clothes and house cleaning. Most residents will be either employed or in training while living at the service, and those that are not will be actively supported to do so.

There will be a space at the properties for physical exercise and recreational activities. These will be encouraged and will contribute to the overall wellbeing of residents. As part of the service residents will be supported into self-directed leisure activities, such as waiata, learning to play a musical instrument or whakairo.

Will residents be employed or in training?

Employment or training is an important support for people who are looking to transition into the community after being sentenced to a corrections facility or a community-based sentence.





Staff will work closely with Corrections employment teams, local employers, and government agencies, such as Ministry of Social Development to identify employment and training opportunities for residents to take up while living at the service.

Many of the residents who will have recently left a corrections facility will have completed trade training or participated in a Corrections release to work programme while serving their sentence in prison.

Will residents agree to any rules or restrictions?

Residents will agree to follow house rules, including a curfew, restrictions around visitors and a ban on alcohol. They will need to abide by any conditions they have on their sentences and orders, such as electronic monitoring or directives to not associate with certain individuals or groups. The residents must demonstrate motivation to be accepted into the service, and this includes distancing themselves from gang members. Gang regalia will not be permitted in the property or worn by residents or visitors.

Will men with high or complex needs be eligible to live at the service?

No, men with high or complex needs will not be eligible. This includes men who:

- Present as being at high risk of harm to others
- Have a high risk of serious reoffending, such as highly violent or sexual offending
- Have serious addiction or substance abuse issues
- Have acute mental illness
- Have cognitive impairments.

Will men with historic convictions for sexually offending against adults and children be permitted to live at the service?

No

Will residents subject to extended supervision orders or intensive monitoring conditions be permitted to live there?

No







Safety

How will we keep the community safe?

Public safety is our top priority, and a person will not be permitted to reside at the service if we think the risk to public safety could not be safely managed.

Staff will provide 24-7 onsite wrap-around support for residents, with at least two staff members awake at all times in 28A-28E Treadwell Street and two covering both 24 and 26 Rata Street. We will install outdoor CCTV cameras to monitor activities on each property.

Residents will be selected through a careful and robust assessment and selection process and must be identified as being motivated to take steps towards reintegrating into the community. Men with current or historic convictions for sexual offending against children or adults will not be eligible for the service.

Residents will have to agree to follow house rules such as a curfew, a ban on alcohol and requiring approval for any visitors. Some may subject to electronic monitoring or directives to not associate with certain individuals or groups.

Antisocial behaviour or breaching the house rules will not be tolerated and could lead to being withdrawn from the service and facing enforcement action before a court or the New Zealand Parole Board.

We will provide a contact number for neighbours to talk with the service manager if there are any concerns.

Will this lead to an increase in local crime?

We do not anticipate an increase in crime rates in Naenae as a result of the proposed service. To ensure this, we plan to work with local and regional Police. Corrections has many residential services like this set up throughout New Zealand and we are not aware of any increase in crime rates in neighbourhoods because of these.







Will this lead to an increase in local gang activity?

We do not anticipate an increase in gang activity in Naenae as a result of the service. Corrections has many residential services like this set up throughout New Zealand and we are not aware of any increase in gang activity in neighbourhoods as a result of these.

Visitors must be pre-approved and will have to apply to visit. They will only be able to visit at prearranged set times and must comply with the house rules while at the properties. Antisocial behaviour from residents or their visitors will not be tolerated and may result in the resident being removed from the service. Gang regalia will not be permitted at the properties, nor worn by residents or visitors.

Public safety is our top priority. We have developed a comprehensive five-year gang strategy aiming to reduce the harm caused by gangs in correction facilities and the community. This includes taking all opportunities to support people with disassociating themselves from gangs and gang related activities.

How will we manage gang affiliations?

Residents will be required to demonstrate that they are making efforts to distance themselves from any gang connections and will not be permitted to wear or display gang regalia on the properties. All visitors will be pre-arranged and will need to be approved in advance. They will have to comply with the house rules while at the properties.

Corrections takes all reasonable steps to discourage people we manage from gang membership by providing programmes and opportunities to support people in disassociating themselves from gangs and gang related activities. We have a comprehensive five-year gang strategy that is aligned to the Whole of Government Action Plan on gangs. This strategy works to ensure communities are less impacted by the antisocial and criminal behaviours of people who are affiliated with gangs by:

- Limiting the criminal behaviours of people under our supervision
- Promoting and enabling gang disengagement
- Promoting people to adopt prosocial lives.

How will we support residents to abide by the conditions and orders of their sentences?





Dedicated probation officers will work closely with iwi staff and actively manage the conditions and orders of the sentences of all residents. If a resident breaches these, they may face penalties, such as increased reporting to Community Corrections, prosecution or being sent to a corrections facility.

Community Corrections staff manage around 30,000 people in the community and are very experienced in working with people released from a corrections facility or serving a community-based sentence or order. There are around 2500 people serving community-based sentences in the Wellington District.

How will we respond if a resident breaches their electronic monitoring condition?

If a resident breaches their electronic monitoring condition by leaving the property without permission they are required to reside at, an alert will automatically be sent to staff at the GPS monitoring centre, who will then contact the supervising probation officer or service manager. The probation officer will contact on-site staff who will confirm that the resident has left the property and then call Police. If afterhours the GPS monitoring centre deal directly with Police. Police will work with the GPS monitoring centre to track the location of the resident and apprehend them.

Will victims be notified?

Yes. Registered victims will be notified in accordance with our legal requirements around the Victims Notification Register. When assessing the suitability of any address for a person being released from a corrections facility, we check that the property is not near the residence of any registered victim.

3. Service provider

Who will deliver the service?

The service will be delivered by a new joint venture between Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa.

What other services and initiatives does Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa deliver?

Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa deliver several services including:

- Health
- Social Services
- Alcohol and drug counselling







- Environmental
- Iwi radio
- Property development.

Why does Corrections work with service providers to deliver residential services?

Corrections engages experienced service providers to provide the specialised skills needed to deliver residential services like this one. They work with Community Corrections staff, such as probation officers, to provide reintegration support for people who we manage. They have existing relationships with key local and regional stakeholders, such as health and hauora providers, employment brokers or agencies that provide training in living or budgeting skills.

Some of the service providers that we work with include Goodwood Park, Salvation Army, Emerge Aotearoa, and iwi-providers.

How many people use Corrections transitional accommodation services?

Currently, around 1,100 people throughout New Zealand make use of our transitional accommodation services each year. This includes emergency accommodation, and supported services, like the one proposed for Naenae.

4. Properties

How many residents will live at each property?

The service will provide twenty-six beds operating from eleven homes across three sites in Naenae:

- 28A-28E Treadwell Street up to eight residents, a whānau room and office space
- 24 and 26 Rata Street up to eighteen residents and office space

Each resident will have their own bedroom. There will only be one resident per bedroom and sharing bedrooms will be prohibited. The properties will include CCTVs and electronic security to provide the community with reassurance that security measures are in place. The CCTV's will be inwards facing.

Why does the service operate from three properties?

These are brand new homes and we want these men to live in a home environment.







Will the different properties provide different services?

No. All services will be a kaupapa Māori transitional housing service.

Who owns the properties?

Kāinga Ora – Homes and Communities purchased 28A-28E Treadwell Street, 24 and 26 Rata Street on behalf of Corrections. If we decide to go ahead, Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa will take on the lease.

What will the properties look like?

There will be few indicators that it will be a Corrections transitional housing service. We will install discreet outdoor CCTV cameras, but these will look the same as any other outdoor security camera designed for a residential dwelling.

Why did we choose these properties?

We reviewed several property options and decided that 28A-28E Treadwell Street, 24 and 26 Rata Street, Naenae were the best properties to establish the service. Some of the factors that influenced our decision were that they:

- Offer high-quality, well-built residential accommodation that aligns with the healthy homes standards
- Have good access to public transport for residents to access social services, employment, training and education

Will residents have access to vehicles?

Yes. Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa will provide transport for the residents.

5. Engagement approach

Will we engage with the community before we make our decision?

We want to engage with local stakeholders and members of the community to find out how the proposed service will affect them and to explore how we can work together if we decide to go ahead. All feedback we receive from our engagement will be carefully considered.

Thanks again for sending through the consents for Rata and Treadwell. Just a couple of questions:
1. Confirmation of address - Treadwell St

I just need to double check addresses. The resource consent for Treadwell St you sent through is for a residential facility at 26D Treadwell (Lot 10 DP51360).

The letter the residents received is for a residential facility located at 28A - 28E Treadwell (Lot 1 - 5 DP552797 RT 957769).

I'm picking the addresses that got changed once the plan was deposited? Do you have a Council letter with the address change? I just want to be crystal clear of the address.

2. Care facility vs Residential Facility - clarification required

Holly Jenkin's original CoC application and subsequent resource consent (RM200105) are for a 'care facility' in Treadwell St whereas you decline the CoC under the term 'residential facility' and also the resource consent decision talks about a 'residential facility'.

The reason I ask, the two categories fall within the same rule (4A 4.1.3 and 4F 4.1.3 (a), policies and objectives, but there is a subtle yet important difference in their definition in the plan.

A residential facility excludes a boarding house and detention facility.

The plan gives a definition of a detention facility as: "a building or buildings for the detention or accommodation of persons detained pursuant to any statutory provision, where such detention is imposed for the protection of members of the public."

We understand it is proposed to have people reside at the Treadwell and Rata residential facilities who are currently undertaking a community-based sentence. There is potential for them to be monitored.

My interpretation of this is that they are in fact 'detained' pursuant to a statutory provision thereby making the two properties meet the definition of a 'detention facility'. Can yourself and James please provide Council's interpretation of this as soon as possible.

3. Number of people allowed at Rata St address

I see the Rata St application was for one additional person (a manager to be onsite) so 11 people are consented to be onsite at one time.

I note that Rule 4A 4.1.3 states that: (a) The maximum number of people accommodated on <u>site</u> including **guests**, staff and permanent residents does not exceed 10.

It is our understanding that residents will be granted access to visitors. If all the rooms are full, plus the staff are onsite, any visitors to the site will exceed what is allowed in the resource consent.

Do you recommend the client apply for an amendment to their consent or will the Council be involved in enforcing these numbers?

The immediate neighbours have only just found out about these properties and their use and have a number of concerns, once being blindsided by the placement of the houses.

I am helping some of the concerned residents gain information about the consenting process, hence my involvement.

We are writing to let you know about Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka, a residential service that Te Rūnanganui o Te Ati Awa and Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira want to establish within the Naenae community at 28A – 28E Treadwell Street and 24 and 26 Rata Street.

This letter provides you with information about Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka and our commitment to keep you fully informed of what is happening within our community.

ABOUT TE WHARE WHAKARURUHAU O RAUMANUKA

Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is committed to fostering positive transformational change and empowering tane Māori to be rangatira for their whānau, hapū and iwi.

Using a kaupapa Māori, tikanga-led framework, our mahi recognises that all tane Māori are vital and integral members of their whānau, with significant and meaningful contributions to make.

As a service for tane Māori who have been released from corrections facilities or are serving community-based sentences, Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka will provide a safe environment that aims to tautoko, awhi and manaaki tane in their journey of reconnection. Most, if not all tane will be from the Wellington region and may whakapapa to Ngāti Toa Rangatira or Te Ati Awa.

Ngāti Toa Rangatira and Te Ati Awa hold long and wide-reaching aspirations for the health, wellbeing and prosperity for our whānau, delivered through a Te Ao Māori lens.

Together, and working in partnership with Ara Poutama Aotearoa (the Department of Corrections) our collective iwi will provide Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumunuka, an iwi-led service that provides transitional housing, 24/7 wrap around support and access to kaupapa Māori health, social, education, employment and cultural services for up to 18 months.

Without a service like this, many of the men who might live at the property would end up living somewhere else in the Naenae community or wider Wellington region without the wrap-around support that they need. Some of them may end up homeless or in unsuitable accommodation, which can lead to reoffending.

Public safety is our top priority

- Residents will undergo a robust assessment and selection process
- A person will not be permitted to reside at the property if we think the risk to public safety could not be safely managed
- Our experienced kaimahi will provide 24-7 onsite wrap around support for residents, with at least two staff members at all times
- We will install outdoor CCTV cameras to monitor activities at the properties
- Men with convictions for sexually offending against adults and children will not be permitted to live at the properties
- Residents will agree to the tikanga and kawa while living at the property, including a ban on alcohol and drugs and requiring approval for any manuhiri

- Residents will be required to demonstrate that they are making efforts to distance themselves from any gang connections and will not be permitted to wear or display gang regalia on the property
- Residents will be subject to the conditions of their sentence or order.

We want to give you the opportunity to korero to us

As mana whenua of the Wellington region and part of the Naenae community, we are committed to delivering this community-based and iwi-led service.

We have carried out our due dilligence and we are confident that the support that we are able to provide will be of benefit to the entire community.

To further strengthen our mahi, ensure the success of the kaupapa and maintain the safety of our community, we want to understand the needs, aspirations, concerns and challenges for our neighbours.

We welcome the opportunity to korero to you, to ensure that you and your whanau are included in the development of our proposal, the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa and address any concerns that you may have.

Representatives from our iwi and our service will be available to meet with individuals or whānau at your whare or at an alternative location from Monday 4 October 2021 to Monday 1 November 2021. They will be available during weekdays from 9.30am – 5pm, with extended availability on Tuesday and Thursday evenings until 7pm throughout this four week period.

Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is a community-based, iwi led transitional housing service to support tane Māori who have been released from a corrections facility, or given a comminunity-based service with support to reconnect with their whānau and the community.

Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is a programme delivered by Te Rūnanganui o Te Ati Awa and Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira, with the support of Ara Poutama Aotearoa.

About Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka

Who is the service for?

The service will be for tane who are motivated and committed to successfully transition into living in the Wellington region and who need the wraparound support that the service can provide.

They will whakapapa to or have close whānau ties with Ngāti Toa and Te Āti Awa and are committed to maintaining the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa.

Is this a prison or corrections facility? No, Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is not a prison or a corrections facility. It is a kaupapa Māori supported accommodation that provides wrap around support and navigational services.

Only people serving community sentences and orders will live in our whare. Residents will be expected to maintain a strong commitment to the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa.

How long will residents live at the service?

Most residents will live at the service between six to twelve months, but some may stay for up to eighteen months if they need further support to reconnect with their whānau and the community. Residents will be supported to move out earlier if they are ready and have found suitable long-term accommodation.

They will continue to receive support after they have moved out, as they transition to life in the community.

How will the residents be selected?

If someone is interested in living in the whare, they will be part of a careful and robust assessment and selection process.

In assessing their suitability, our service will carefully consider:

- Their motivation to rehabilitate to a crime-free life
- Any rehabilitation programmes they have undertaken
- Whether they will get on with other residents in the service
- Whānau connections in the area
- Any risk to public safety or victims
- Their demonstrated motivation to distance themselves from any gang connections.

Will there be any rules and regulations within the whare?

All residents will need to agree to the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa. Our tikanga and kawa will be firm but fair, to ensure the safety of all our residents, kaimahi and the community.

Our kawa will include a curfew, clear times for manuhiri and a ban on drugs and alcohol.

Additional to our tikanga and kawa, residents will also need to comply with any conditions they have on their sentence and orders.

The residents must demonstrate motivation to be accepted into the service, and this includes distancing themselves from gang members. Gang regalia will not be permitted in the property or worn by residents or manuhiri.





Our priority is to ensure community safety

How will we keep the community safe?

The safety of the community is our top priority.

A person will not be permitted to reside at the whare if we think the risk to public safety could not be safely managed.

Our kaimahi will provide 24-7 onsite wrap-around support for residents, with at least two staff members awake at all times in 28A-28E Treadwell Street and two covering both 24 and 26 Rata Street.

We will install outdoor CCTV cameras to monitor activities on each property.

Residents will be selected through a careful and robust assessment and selection process and must be committed and motivated to futurefocused transformational change and leading healthy, safe and resilient lives.

Men with current or historic convictions for sexual offending against children or adults will not be eligible for the service.

Residents must commit to living by the tikanga and kawa of our kaupapa and Ara Poutama Aotearoa and the New Zealand Police will be responsible for any enforcement action taken if residents place themselves, other residents, our kaimahi or the community at risk.

Ara Poutama Aotearoa and Police will act swiftly to address any actions by residents that place themselves, our kaimahi or the public at risk, or breach any parole or sentencing requirements. Unsafe or antisocial behaviour will not be tolerated and could lead to being withdrawn from the whare and facing enforcement action before a court or the New Zealand Parole Board.

Will men with high or complex needs be eligible to live at the service?

No, men with high or complex needs will not be eligible.

This includes men who:

- Present as being at high risk of harm to others
- Have a high risk of serious reoffending, such as highly violent or sexual offending
- Have serious addiction or substance abuse issues
- Have acute mental illness
- Have cognitive impairments.

Men with historic convicitions for sexually offending against adults and children will not be permitted to live at the service.

Can the community provide feedback?

Āe, we welcome feedback and input from the wider community to provide feedback to assist in the development of our tikanga and kawa.

As mana whenua in the region, Te Ati Awa and Ngāti Toa Rangatira are committed to delivering this service and ensuring that the tikanga and kawa of our service is maintained at all times.

Kia ora koutou,

If there's to be any further correspondence with Corrections could we ask them to confirm the Treadwell Street location? They mentioned "just around the corner from Rata Street". There is a row of newly built townhouses at 26D Treadwell Street (opposite where our new pool will be built), but I wasn't under the impression they were Kāinga Ora ones. There are older existing KO homes in each direction from Rata Street which they could potentially redevelop.

The consent issued for 24 and 26 Rata Street in October was to Kāinga Ora for six large townhouses "to be utilised by Kainga Ora as Community Residential Transitional Housing". No mention of it being a Corrections facility, unlike the most recent consent issued for 11 Hillary Court which did purport to be for a Corrections boarding house:

"The area of the proposal has been leased to Whanau Ora, who have a long-term contract with Corrections and the Ministry of Social Development to provide transitional and holistic accommodation for clients to spend 6 months on release prior to full release back into society. The clients will be supervised/cared for, drug and alcohol tested and undergo further job training."

Kāinga Ora has purchased the property, but the process is a bit different to usual. We have purchased the property on behalf of Corrections, for their specific needs, rather than our general public or transitional housing pipeline.

As some background, Kāinga Ora plays a role supporting Corrections' Housing and Support Services programme by purchasing properties on behalf of Corrections, based on their needs for housing. Corrections then contracts a local service provider to lease the property from Kāinga Ora and deliver the service to manage the property and support residents.

Given the nature of the service, Corrections lead engagement and communication so the right people are able to share information and talk through in more detail how the properties will be managed, including engagement with local officials. I hope this helps. I understand Corrections have provided more information about this work, and the service, and can help you with further questions you might have.

This letter provides you with information about Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka and our commitment to keep you fully informed of what is happening within our community.

ABOUT TE WHARE WHAKARURUHAU O RAUMANUKA Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka is committed to fostering positive transformational change and empowering tane Māori to be rangatira for their whānau, hapū and iwi.

Using a kaupapa Māori, tikanga-led framework, our mahi recognises that all tane Māori are vital and integral members of their whanau, with significant and meaningful contributions to make.

As a service for tane Māori who have been released from corrections facilities or are serving community-based sentences, Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumanuka will provide a safe environment that aims to tautoko, awhi and manaaki tane in their journey of reconnection. Most, if not all tane will be from the Wellington region and may whakapapa to Ngāti Toa Rangatira or Te Ati Awa.

Ngāti Toa Rangatira and Te Ati Awa hold long and wide-reaching aspirations for the health, wellbeing and prosperity for our whānau, delivered through a Te Ao Māori lens.

Together, and working in partnership with Ara Poutama Aotearoa (the Department of Corrections) our collective iwi will provide Te Whare Whakaruruhau o Raumunuka, an iwi-led service that provides transitional housing, 24/7 wrap around support and access to kaupapa Māori health, social, education, employment and cultural services for up to 18 months.

- Residents will be subject to the conditions of their sentence or order.

Dear Mayor Barry

I am writing to follow up your request for additional information about the residential services that we want to establish at 24-26 Rata Street and 28 Treadwell Street, Naenae.

When we met on 14 December, you asked for information about our process for selecting Naenae as the location for the services, other properties in the region that we considered and why we chose these two properties.

In February 2019, the Housing and Support Services Programme team began searching the Wellington region for suitable properties to establish community

residential transitional housing services. We undertook significant searching in the region, working with Kainga Ora and engaging with several property agents and developers. However, we fast failed most of these properties because they either:

- Did not meet Ara Poutama Aotearoa or Kāinga Ora's physical, geospatial or community requirements
- Were sold while we or Kāinga Ora were undertaking due diligence
- Otherwise became unavailable.

We identified 35 properties that met our requirements on face value and remained available throughout our due diligence process, but on further investigation these did not meet our requirements due to several factors, including:

- Needing significant capital modifications or alterations
- Quality of the construction, building materials or design
- Did not meet the healthy homes standards
- Over market price or not commercially viable
- Would not be constructed in time to meet the existing accommodation need
- Proximity to sensitive locations
- Poor access to social services, employment opportunities, shopping or public transport.

We finished searching properties in the Wellington region for transitional housing services, and 24-26 Rata Street is the final property we considered in that process.

24-26 Rata Street and 28 Treadwell Street were presented to us by a private developer. We decided to go ahead with these properties because they will:

- Offer high-quality, well-built residential accommodation that aligns with the healthy homes standards
- Align with our service design requirements, in that they offer shared accommodation, with options for residents to progress to highly independent living while residing in the property
- Have good access to public transport, which makes it easier for residents to access social services, employment, training and education

The properties are located in an area that has a high existing accommodation need and where people in our care with an identified need want to live or return to. Around one third of the people in our care who are currently in the community in the Wellington region live in Lower Hutt. If we go ahead with the service, residents will:

- Have access to local employment opportunities
- Reside close to public transport, shopping area, health services, services and Ministry of Social Development
- In a community that offers local social services and social infrastructure that will support Māori and Pasifika residents.
