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Stokes Valley Short and Long Term Resilience

Tēnā koutou katoa,

We received an email from **Cr** Brady Dyer requesting a response to the questions below from a Stokes Valley resident:

Suggestions for the short and long term resilience of Stokes Valley

- 1) make the pedestrian/cycling/scootering route out of Stokes Valley across to the River paths very clear and safe at the moment its neither and do the same for getting from the river across to Pomare at the moment if you want to avoid the traffic jam by walking/cycling/scootering to Pomare to catch the train you have to navigate a dangerous crossing through busy roundabouts that's not easy to find when you're doing it for the 1st time to get across to the river from Stokes Valley then it's also dangerous crossing back at Pomare
- 2) much as a bridge to the motorway is needed and overdue it won't help resilience much we need alternate routes out of Stokes Valley e.g. over the hill to Naenae/Taita etc

Is this something we can look at? It is a good opportunity to do so with more people ditching the car to get around the congestion.

The response from officers follows:

Officers have started looking at a cycleway from the Stokes Valley shopping area to connect to the Hutt River Trail in order to provide a safer cycling environment, provide sustainable transport options and reduce emissions.

While there are currently no plans for a new bridge to be constructed linking Stokes Valley and State Highway 2 or plans for a second access road, officers will consider all options when we look at the long term solution for Stokes Valley.
