Rubbish & Recycling at your multi-unit development

We want to make rubbish & recycling easy for everyone in Te Awa Kairangi ki Tai / Lower Hutt, including people with shared bins.

That's why we've worked with the property developer and our contractor to create this guide.





Please note: It is possible that the properties around you may have different collection types.



Your collection type:

All bins/crate kerbside

Kerb-facing properties may/will have standard kerbside collection

Communal/shared storage area (all rubbish, mixed recycling, and glass)

Communal/shared storage area for general waste and mixed recycling (glass kerbside)

All bins/crates kerbside in designated collection area

Rubbish

You've Reduced, you've Reused, and you've Recycled - for most other things, you'll need your rubbish bin.

YES

• General rubbish: any household waste.

Did you know?

When green waste goes to landfill it creates methane, a powerful greenhouse gas contributing to the climate crisis.

Instead of putting it into your red-lid bin, try composting or signing up to our green waste service.

- Hot ashes (let them cool)
- Liquids (hazardous liquids need to go to Silverstream Landfill transfer station)
- Green waste (if you have a green-lid bin)
- Hazardous waste such as large batteries and gas bottles (these can go to Silverstream Landfill free-of-charge. Single-use batteries – e.g. button and alkaline – can go into your rubbish bin)
- Heavy items such as machinery or large amounts of metal (these can go to Macauley Metals)

Recycling

These bin(s) are for items / materials that we accept for recycling here in Te Awa Kairangi ki Tai / Lower Hutt.

(Recycling bins at multi-unit homes: Please make sure you are using the right bin by checking the sticker where applicable)

YES

- Paper and cardboard
- Tins and cans

Of course, putting items into your bins is just the first part of the process! To find out where your recycling ends up, head over to toogoodtowaste.nz/ where-recycling-goes

- Food scraps
- Nappies
- Dead animals yep, we've had those too!
- Dog poo or poo of any kind...
- Glass
- Drink cartons / Tetra Pak
- Polystyrene, clothes hangers or toys
- Soft plastics, cling film and strapping
- Coffee / takeaway cups
- Plant pots
- Paint or hazardous substance containers

Glass recycling

You've enjoyed the refreshing bottle of your favourite drink and the tasty jar of spaghetti sauce - now it's time to recycle them.

YES

- Clean glass bottles
- Clean glass jars

Where does it go?

First, your glass recycling is sorted at kerbside.

Once collected, it all goes to VISY in Tāmaki Makaurau / Auckland, where it's turned into new bottles and jars. VISY have sites across the world!

- Cans/tins (these are for your recycling bin)
- Broken glass (wrap up and put into your rubbish bin)
- Lids, caps or corks (these are for your rubbish bin)
- Tableware or Pyrex (this is for your rubbish bin if it can't be donated)
- Drinking glasses (these are for your rubbish bin if they can't be donated)
- Light bulbs (these are for your rubbish bin)
- Mirrors or window glass (please take to Silverstream Landfill)

Green waste (optional)

You may have access to a green waste bin, which helps you to dispose of garden waste sustainably.

YES

- Grass clippings
- Plant cuttings
- Small wood cuttings
- Flax and cabbage tree leaves

Don't have a green waste bin?

Take your green waste to the green waste drop-off at Silverstream transfer station or Seaview transfer station.

- Rubbish (this is for your rubbish bin)
- Dirt or soil (please take these to Silverstream Landfill)
- Concrete or stone (please take these to Silverstream Landfill)
- Nappies (these are for your rubbish bin)
- Food waste (please put this into your rubbish bin or compost)
- Pet waste (pop this into your rubbish bin)
- Chemically treated wood products (please take these to the Landfill)

Let's reduce the amount of waste that goes to landfill

Remember the three Rs:

Reduce - cut down on the amount of waste you create, especially plastic.

Reuse - can any of these bottlers or containers be used again?

Recycle - If it's on our list of recyclable items, make sure it's clean and then put it in your yellowlid bin. Search for specific items at **toogoodtowaste.nz**
