Māori Ward Poll - Hutt City Council

The outcome of the poll is binding and will determine whether a Māori Ward will be retained for the Hutt City Council elections in 2028 and 2031. The First Past the Post (FPP) Electoral System will be used for this poll.

Amalgamation Poll - Hutt City Council

A poll will be held in conjunction with the above elections to confirm whether Hutt City Council should explore amalgamation options with Wellington, Upper Hutt, and Porirua City Councils and the Greater Wellington Regional Council. The outcome of the poll will be non-binding. Hutt City Council will use the outcome of the poll as part of its future policy direction on amalgamation.
