This is an application by Navigation Liquor Limited for a Temporary Authority in respect of premises situated at 63 Jackson Street, Petone, Lower Hutt, known as "Liquor King Petone".

The application was duly advertised and no objection, opposition or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, the application by Navigation Liquor Limited for a Temporary Authority is **granted**, subject to conditions.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 and s.106 of the Act.

STATUTORY CRITERIA

Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

- o (g) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes on the premises to engage in, the provision of services other than those directly related to the sale of alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which services:
- o (h) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be reduced, to more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence:
- o (i) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality are already so badly affected by the effects of the issue of existing licences that
 - (i) they would be unlikely to be reduced further (or would be likely to be reduced further to only a minor extent) by the effects of the issue of the licence; but
 - (ii) it is nevertheless desirable not to issue any further licences:
- (*j*) whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law:
- (k) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made under <u>section 103</u>.
- (2) The authority or committee must not take into account any prejudicial effect that the issue of the licence may have on the business conducted pursuant to any other licence.

The District Licensing Committee, acting pursuant to the Sale and Supply Of Alcohol Act 2012, and under the provisions of the Hutt City Local Alcohol Policy, **grants** an application

by Navigation Liquor Limited for a Temporary Authority for the premises at 63 Jackson Street, Petone, Lower Hutt, trading as "Liquor King Petone", subject to conditions.
