The purpose of the committee is to focus on the big regional issues and opportunities that cross boundaries, like transport, housing, climate change and iwi capacity.

Questions and discussion points

- The Regional Emissions Reduction Project is on track to be completed by March 2024. A plan has been developed and identified key areas to reduce carbon emissions at a regional level within this time.
- The Future Development Strategy (FDS) is under consultation. The FDS
 Project Lead is on the WRLC core team to keep projects connected. Work is ongoing to have the projects in sync with one another.
- The WRLC is aware the plan is operating outside of the LTP process, where Council's funding for climate change is likely going to local projects.

Next steps

- End of October 2023 have a draft strategic framework developed, with focus areas, potential actions and advocacy opportunities.
- Present this draft to the WRLC at a workshop being held on 30 October 2023.
- By end of December 2023, following further refinement, the draft plan will be presented to the WRLC, with final sign off by March 2024.
