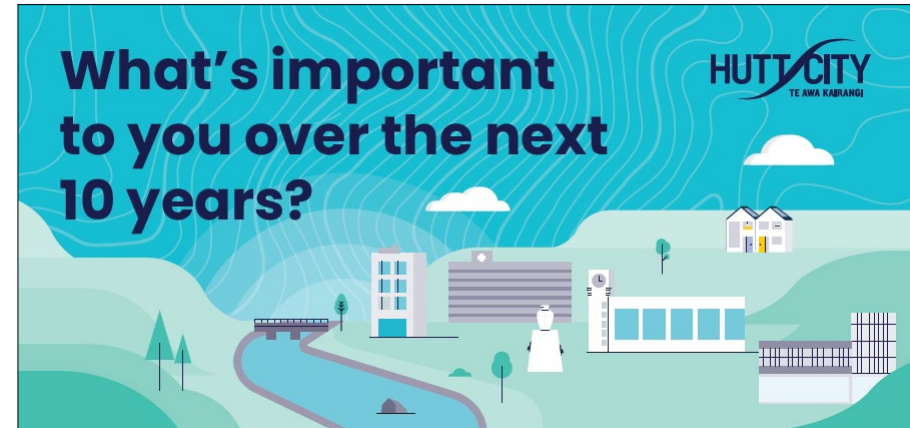
Purpose & objectives of early engagement

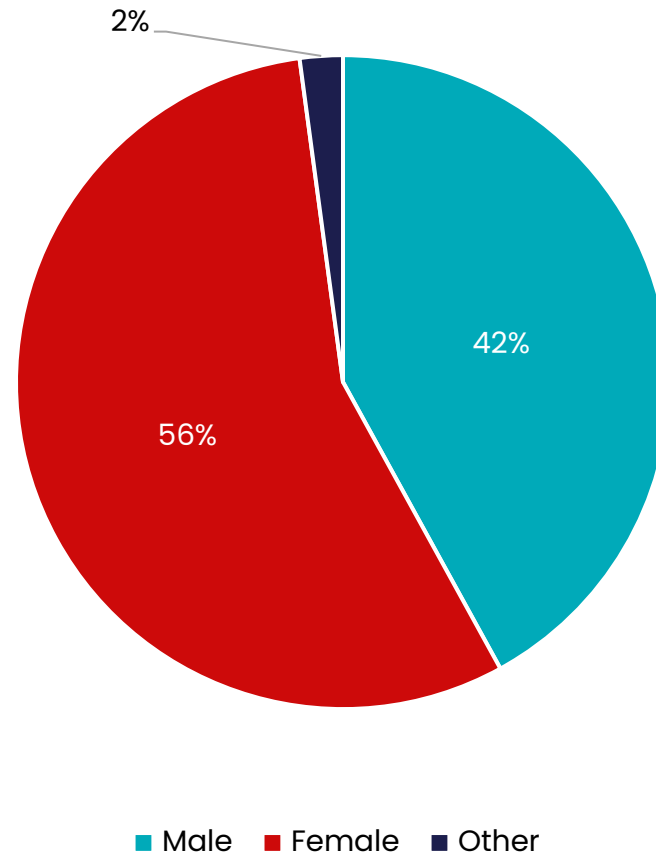

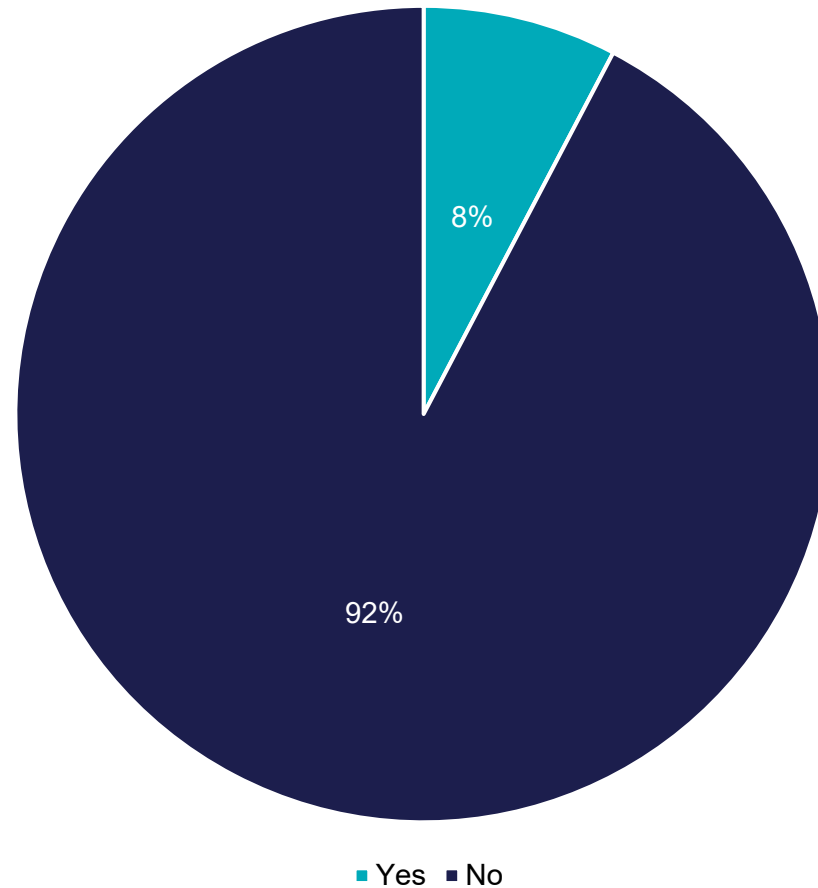
Survey representation by ward

Survey representation by gender

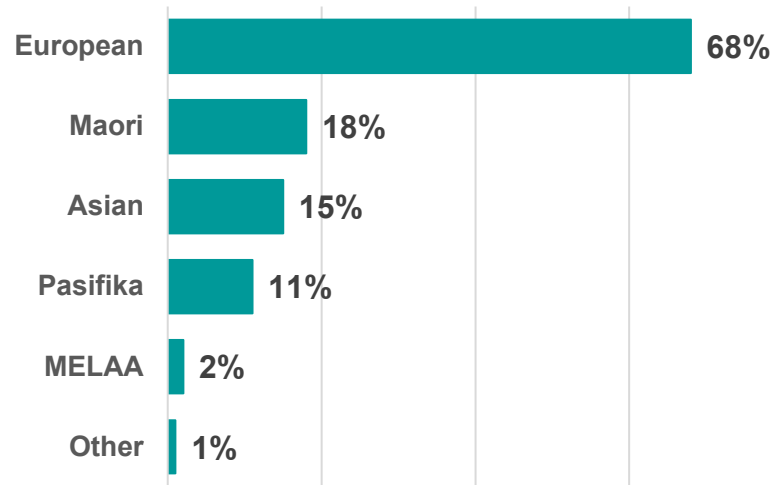


Survey representation by disability

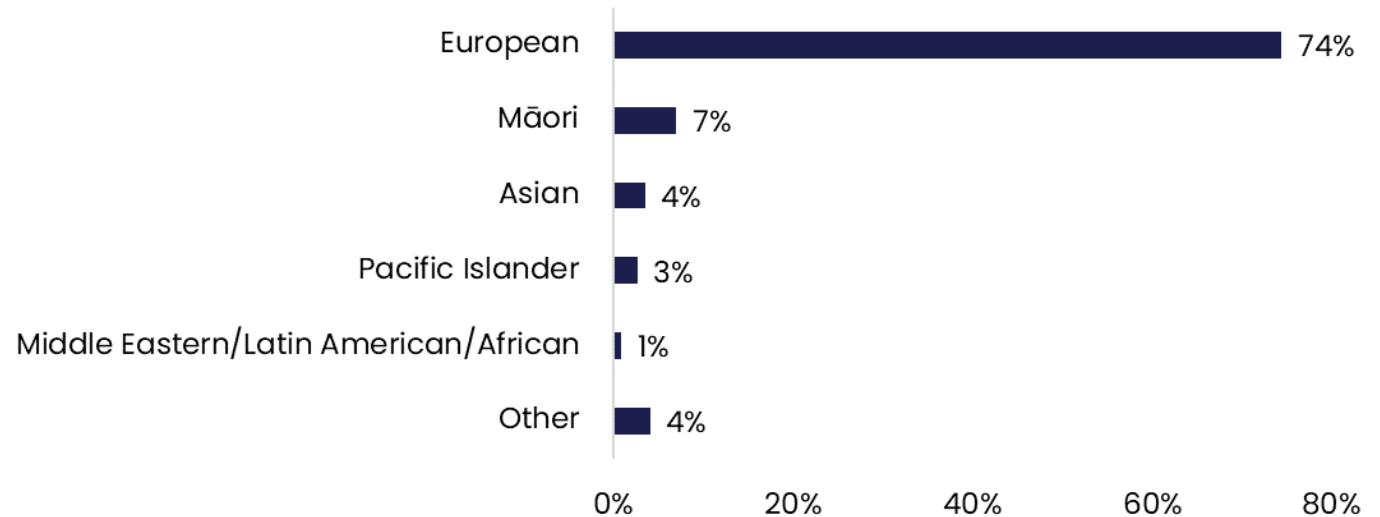


Survey representation by ethnicity

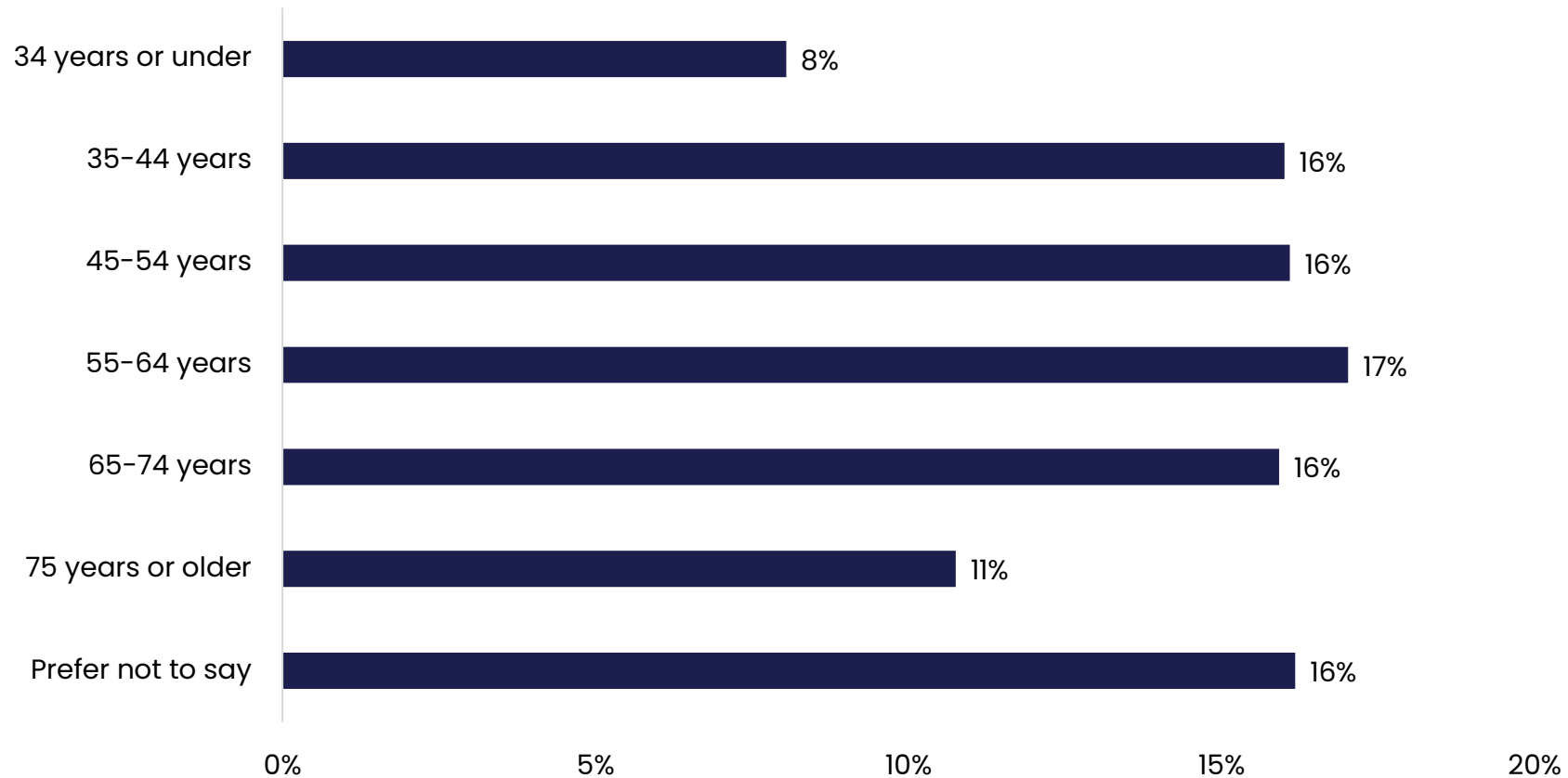
Ethnicity Distribution of Lower Hutt (Census 2018)



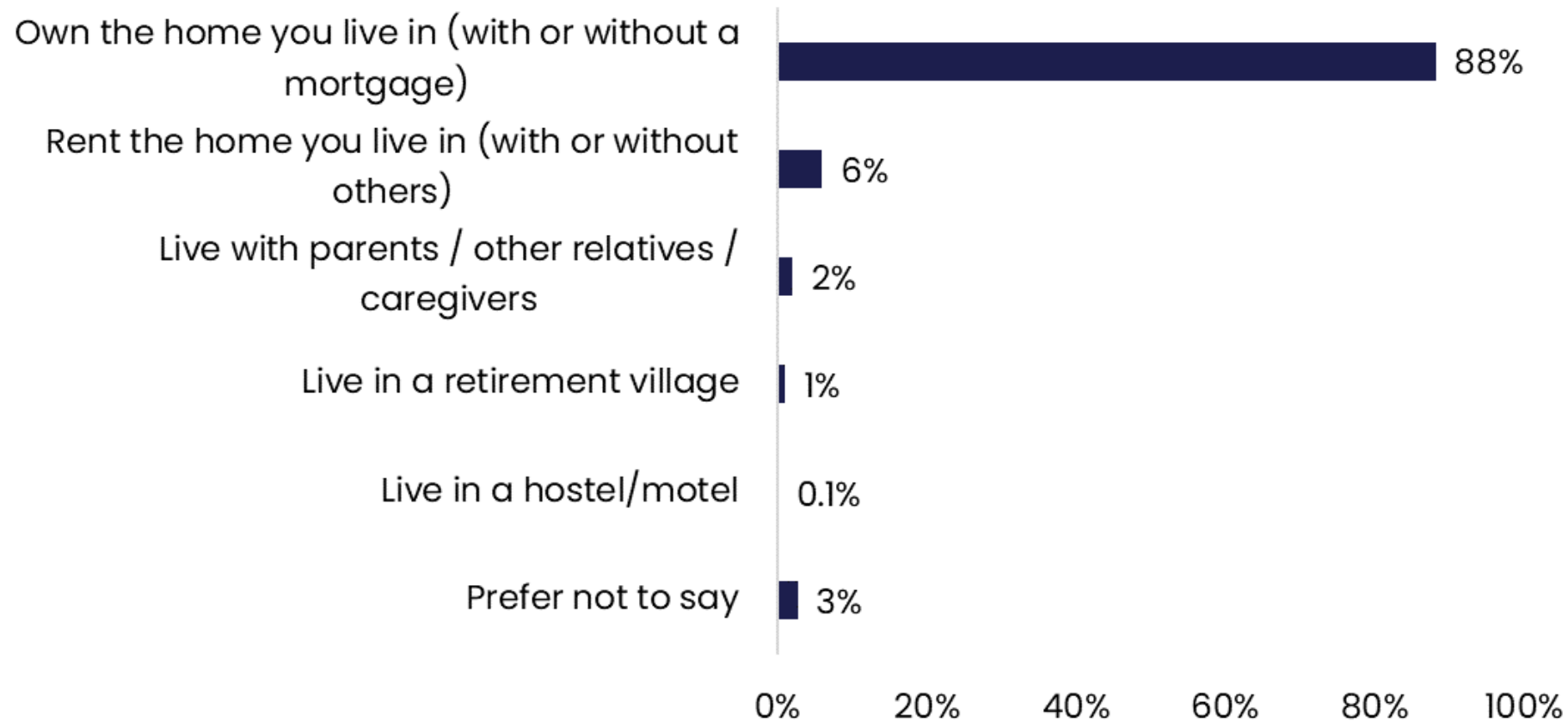
Ethnicity distribution of the survey sample



Survey representation by age

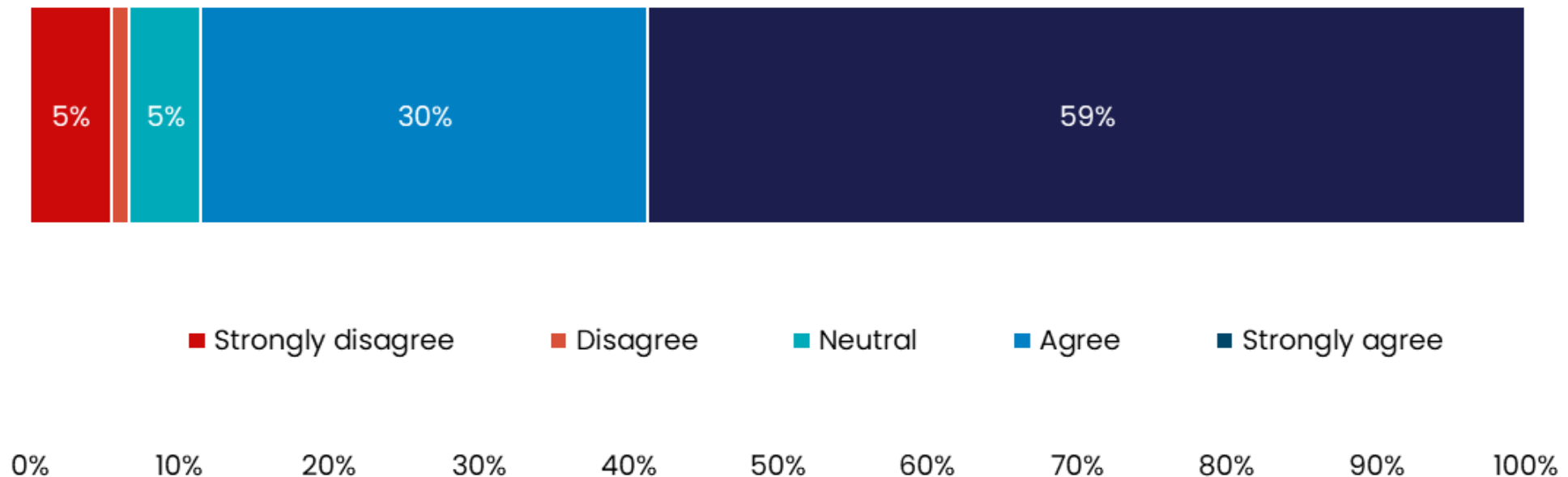


Survey representation by homeownership status

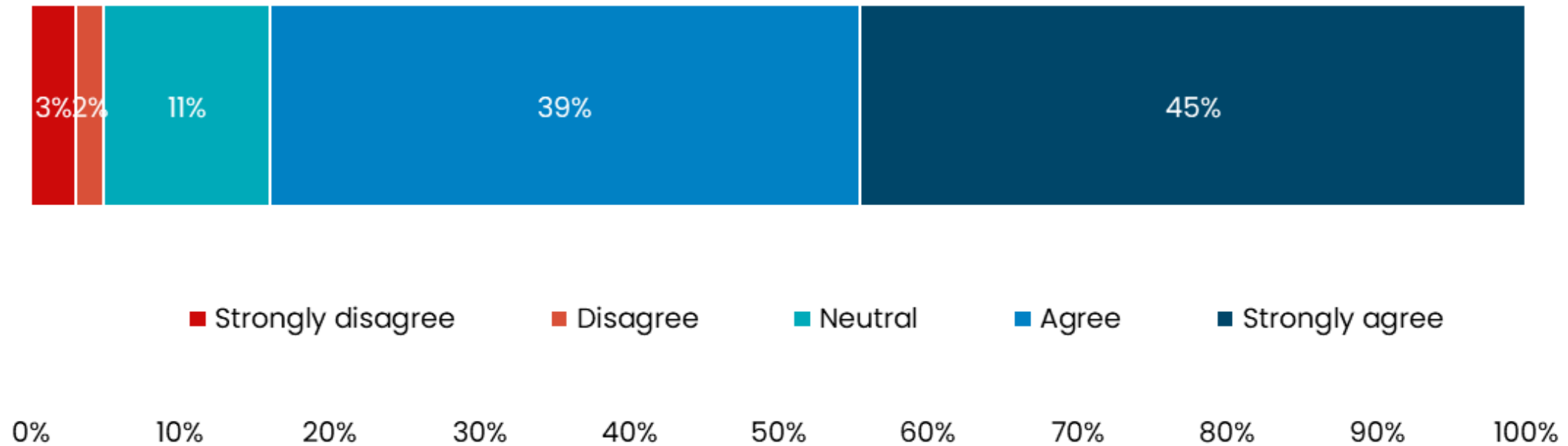

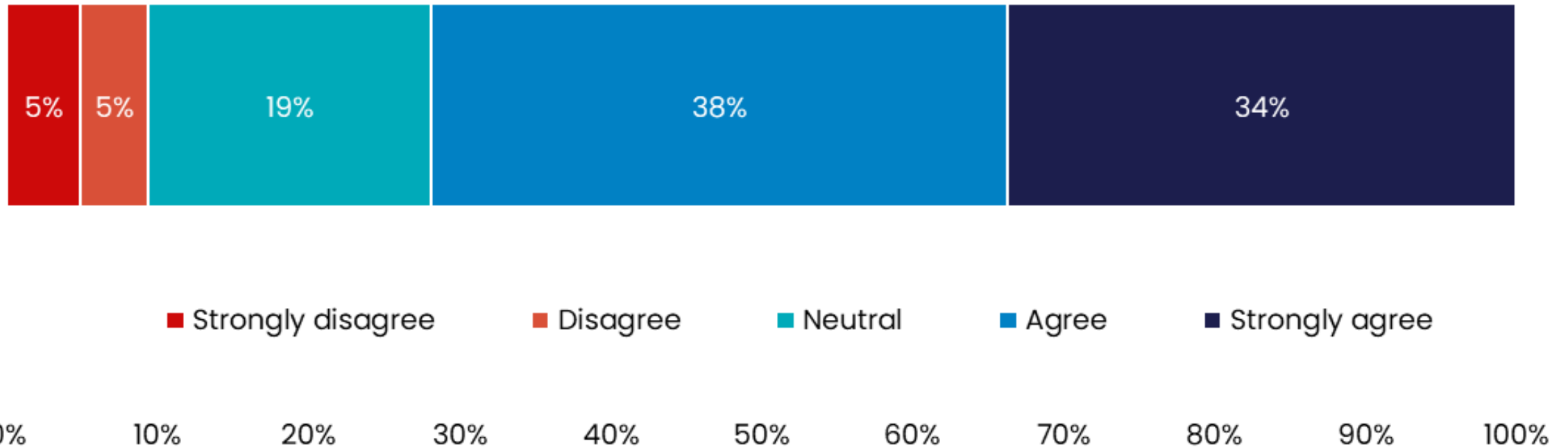

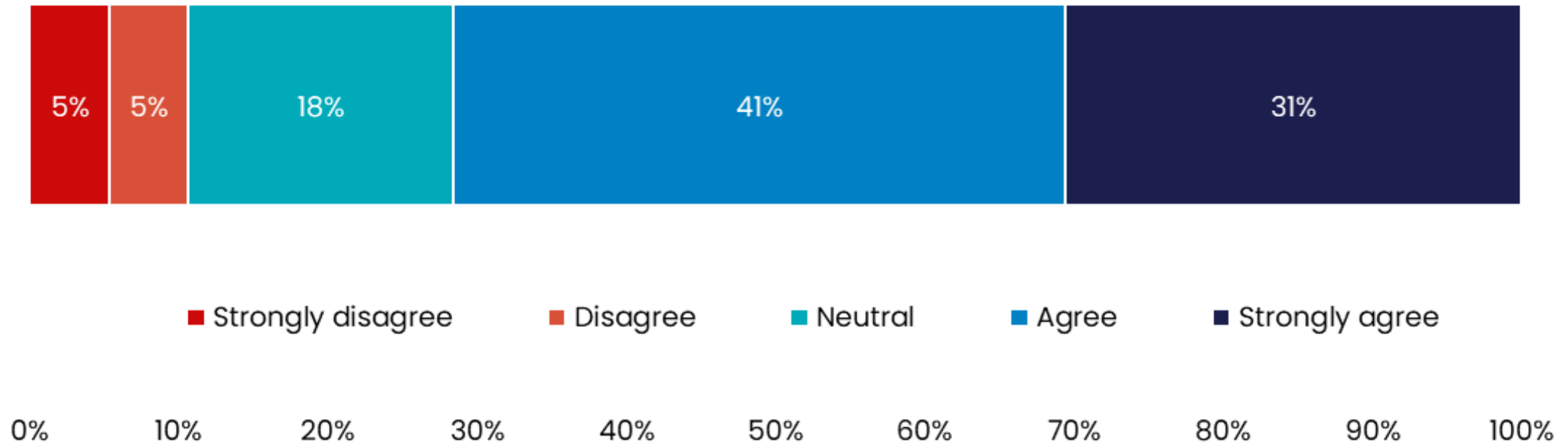

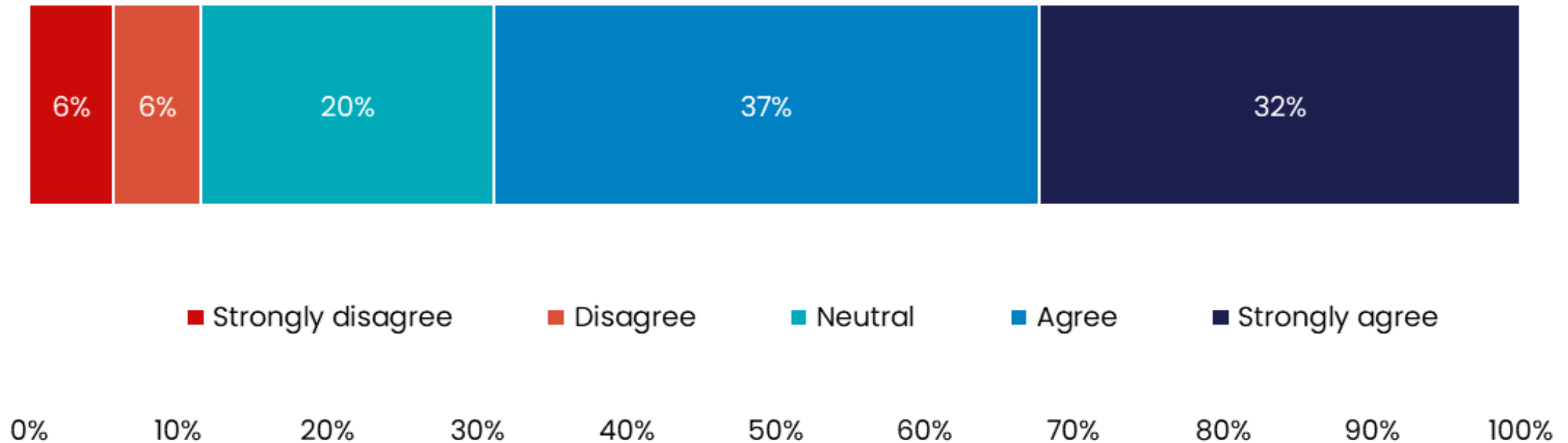

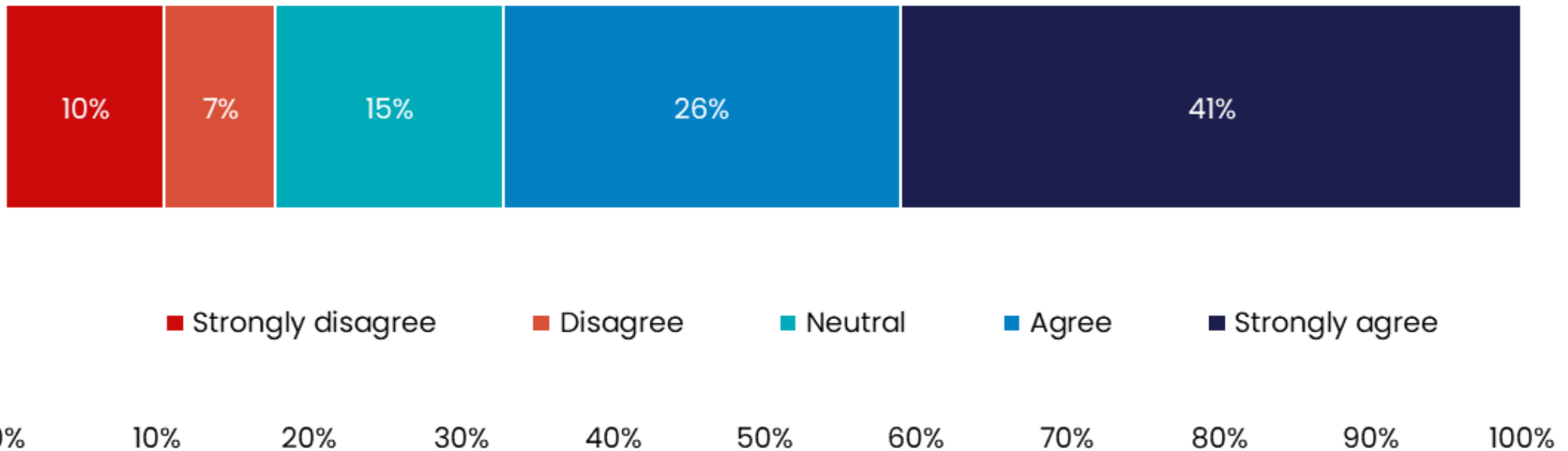

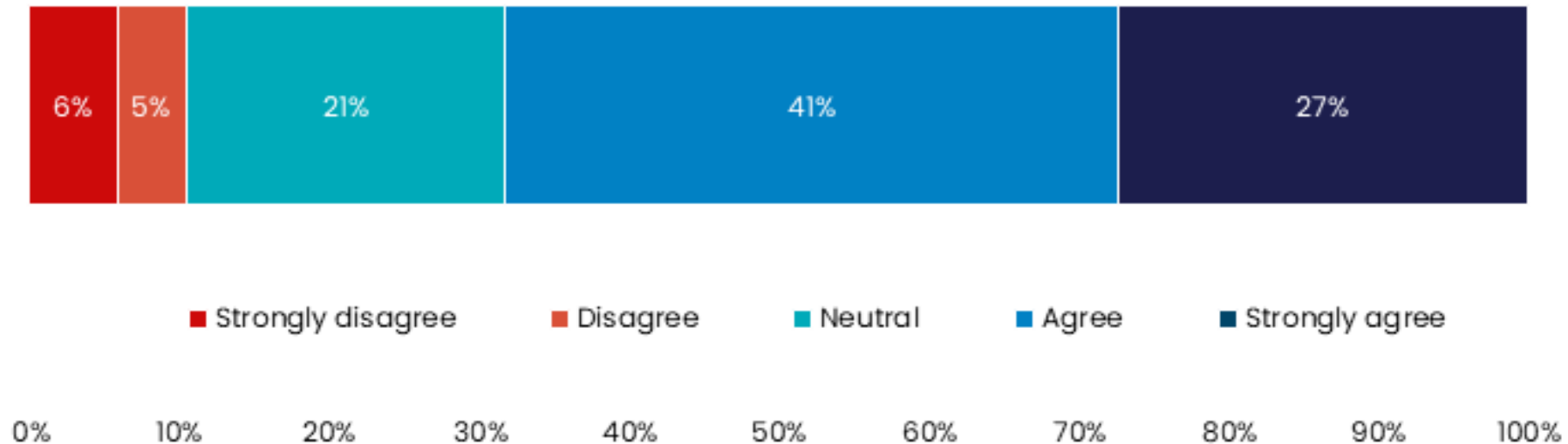
