Questions and discussion points

- The development of the sensory garden was still in progress. There had been no plans to install a crossing as the garden was intended to be temporary and moveable due to the Riverlink stop bank works.
- The site was being made safe, and once completed, the northern section would become usable for parking, subject to approval by the Traffic Subcommittee.
- The service lane beside the site was maintained as a one-way, narrow, and low-speed route. Bollards were to be installed along the laneway to prevent cars from entering the activation space.
- Concrete bollards were designed to also serve as seating. The proposed stage was intended to be moveable.
- The car park was supplementary, and the exact number of spaces for parking had not yet been determined.
- The space was designed to accommodate a range of disabilities.
- A confirmed timeline was not available, but it was anticipated that the stop bank works would commence around June 2026. The site would remain usable during the initial stages of the stop bank project.
- The pump track design had been successfully used at multiple locations.
 This site was also tested and deemed suitable by the company responsible for the design.

Next steps

 Further engagement to take place through December 2024 and January 2025.

- This creates a unique opportunity which will not be repeated in future years.






















Sensory garden

Timeline

- · Oct-Dec: Engage with local residents & businesses.
- · Jan-Feb: Make the site safe: even surface, fix trip hazards, lighting.
- · March: Activation features delivered and installed.

The activation will remain in place until the stopbank works start (at least until June 2026).

All features are relocatable. Parks & Reserves team are keen to re-use the pump track. The basketball hoop is recycled from the RiverBank car park.
