Background to Response:

- The main focus of this submission is specific to Martha Turnell Crescent, Manor Park, Lower Hutt & immediate residential environment.
- It is a newly built house & property, along with several others on a large patch of vacant land, & was completed by a reputed local property developer, with legitimate resource consents from the Hutt City Council (HCC), 5 years ago.
- An undated letter in the mail box recently from Chief Executive of HCC titled, "Submissions are now open on Lower Hutt's Proposed District Plan, which includes Changes that could affect your property".

Quoting further, "We are contacting you as your property is identified as being within a high natural hazard area. Please note that it is possible that you may receive more than one letter relating to potential changes affecting your property in the proposed plan".

 As a feed-back to HCC, this letter when first read was shocking & confusing leaving residents unhappy & highly worried about potential risks to life/injury & also, loss of huge personal sacrifices including use of retirement savings to have ownership of property here.

A Review of Proposed District Plan (PDP):

- The PDP in terms of how relevant it is to the area of my specific focus, to me is not a rulebook, only as a reasonable guide, yet with some reservations.
- The sources of information & the basis on which the PDP has been compiled together are from agencies as GNS, Wellington Water, Wellington Regional Council etc, as acknowledged by HCC.
- Thus, I reckon, under the current circumstances & time frame laid-out by HCC, agreeing tentatively to PDP is the best option available with some reservations /amendmens.

Reservations while tentatively accepting the PDP

(1) Flooding Hazard from Hutt River:

- The area being geomorphologically within the flood plain of the Hutt River. understandably experienced historical flooding issues. Since flood protection mitigation measures have been put in place after that era, and it is generally accepted by the community that the flooding hazard has been contained /well managed.
- However, there is always the probability of unforeseen weather events (erratic frequent heavy deluges) failing to be captured in best of modelling tools & estimates (even though they have taken stock for current worldwide climate changes /manifestations). Thus, Flood Zoning as per PDP by layering of thematic spatial maps over this area with historical & potential flooding hazards, could only offer guidelines for best land use & management

(2) Flooding Hazard from Belmont Reserve Catchments:

Drainage Water Pipes in the Belmont Reserve catchments currently assist the smooth flow of water to Hutt River under the residential properties. There is high probability of pipes being damaged /non-functional due to unforeseen climate events (erratic frequent heavy deluges due to climate change as well), as activation of geo-tectonics in the area. These could definitely change the flood hazard Zoning of PDP

(3) Some limitations of scientific data used in PDP:

- Modelling data quality issues, overfitting, changing conditions, ethical concerns
- GIS Thematic Spatial Maps for layering used spatial data primarily from observation than experimentation
- Geo-tectonics data quality issues from changing dynamics of geology affecting accuracy of modelling & predictive estimate

Mitigation measures requested from HCC during public hearing of PDP in late 2025 to help improve wellness & wellbeing / quality of life of Residents living in the "high natural hazard area" of Manor Park:

- Provide Wastewater Pumping Stations in collaboration with Wellington Water in appropriate sites
- Ensure zero tolerance to roadside general waste /debris clogging the existing roadside drainage inlets by implementing a strict cleaning routine of road sweeping & grass mowing bordering the road network (currently irregular/neglected)
- Regular monitoring /roadside checks on existing roadside & other drainage systems
 & make changes as how to improve the efficiency
- In collaboration with Wellington Regional Council /Wellington Water, regular monitoring /checks on existing water drainage pipes in Belmont Catchment facing Manor Park. Proactively seeking funds to replace them with bigger pipes to efficiently help the flow, while wisely forward planning for frequent & erratic rainfall events from on-going climate change
