
Ngau Matau Bay

- Construction begins at the southern end of Ngau Matau bay
- This aims to make significant progress during the Torea breeding off-season to minimise disruptions.





Whiorau bay



- Construction continues south past the Skerrett boat shed
- A temporary causeway enables crews to continue construction safely and efficiently due to the limited space available



York Bay



- Finishing touches
- Street furniture installation
- Landscaping to follow in May



Sunshine Bay



- Partial completion
- Sewer main work at southern end
- Street furniture installation and line marking



Bird Protection Areas

- Education campaign engagement
 has been great
- Tamariki from Muritai school have created new bird protection area signage for the Eastern Bays
- Approximately 200 penguin boxes have been installed so far
- 2024 breading season, 8 nesting pairs were actively monitored





Traffic Control



- Expanding the traffic management area at Whiorau Bay allows the project to progress south in Whiorau Bay and begin work at the southern end of Ngau Matau Bay.
- For the safety of all road users, we ask for vigilance when navigating through work sites


Halfway Mark Event
