Seaview Energy Resilience Project Petone Community Board Meeting





Project Background

- Fuel received via Seaview Wharf supplies fuel throughout lower North Island.
- The <u>Seaview Energy Resilience Project</u> will replace the existing fuel pipeline and upgrade the Seaview Wharf.
- This will enable these critical assets to be resilient to an earthquake and continue to provide this critical lifeline service.
- It also future-proofs this asset to changes in fuel types.

The project is being undertaken in three stages:

- Stage 1 pipeline replacement, Point Howard to Port Rd (completed)
- Stage 2 Seaview Wharf upgrade and pipeline replacement (underway)
- Stage 3 onshore pipeline replacement (underway)
- Z Energy is leading the pipeline replacement (for pipeline owners).
- CentrePort are leading the wharf upgrade.



Stage 3 – new pipeline in Port Road







Stage 3

- Port Road closed from Wednesday 23 April '25 for 3-months.
- Motor home waste dump station on Port Rd will be closed.
- North bound bus stop on corner of Seaview Rd and Port Rd will be closed.
- Access to Seaview Marina and all businesses maintained.
- Alternate routes for pedestrians and cyclists to be implemented.
- Electronic signage boards to be erected to warn of the closure.
- Vital that southbound traffic turn at Barnes St or Gracefield Rd.
- All affected businesses have been door knocked to discuss.
- When Port Road re-opens, a one-way system will be implemented which will remain in place until Xmas.
- Re-opening the road to 2-way traffic will be progressively implemented once all works have been completed.

Stage 2 Update

- Main wharf upgrades continue e.g. mooring dolphins and foam fire suppression system
- Work on approach wharf elements underway
- On track for completion mid 2025
- Point Howard Wharf demolition (for HCC) near completion
- Point Howard reinstatement design (interface with Tupua Horo Nuku) late 2025
- Staging wharf removal 2026??
