- Current problem: Heavy traffic on narrow local streets outside 3x schools, unsafe to walk/cycle to school
- Opportunity: Safety improvements and mode shift
- Speed bumps, intersection narrowing, chicanes, removing on-street parking

What the community said

- Confusion on the blue restricted parking lines on Konini St
 - *“Why are they there and why cant we park to pick up our kids safely”*
- Concern on the tightness of the chicanes on Totara St
 - Designs are being checked, and line marking and hit sticks are planned to be realigned for moderation.



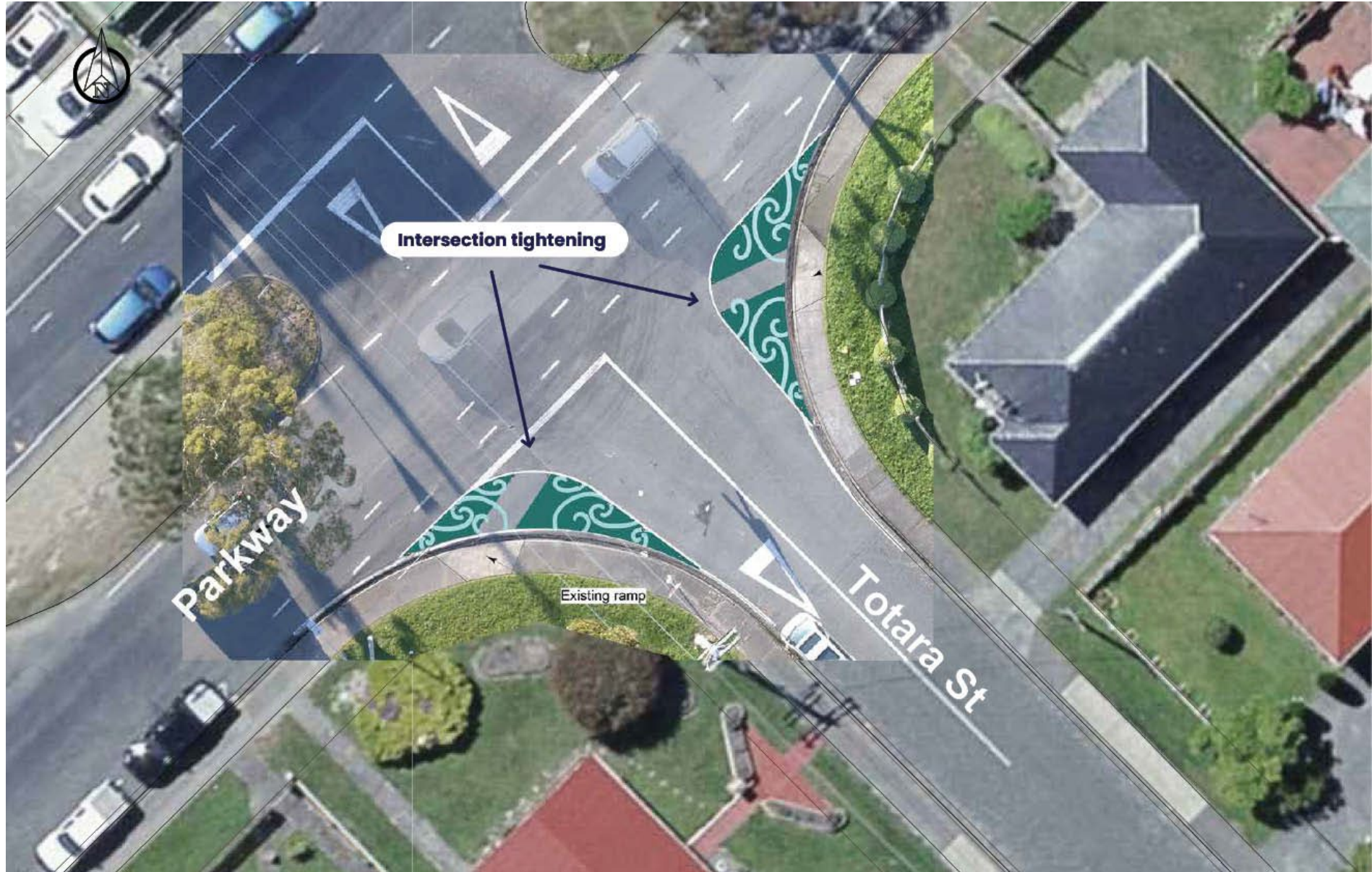
Cultural narrative of the designs

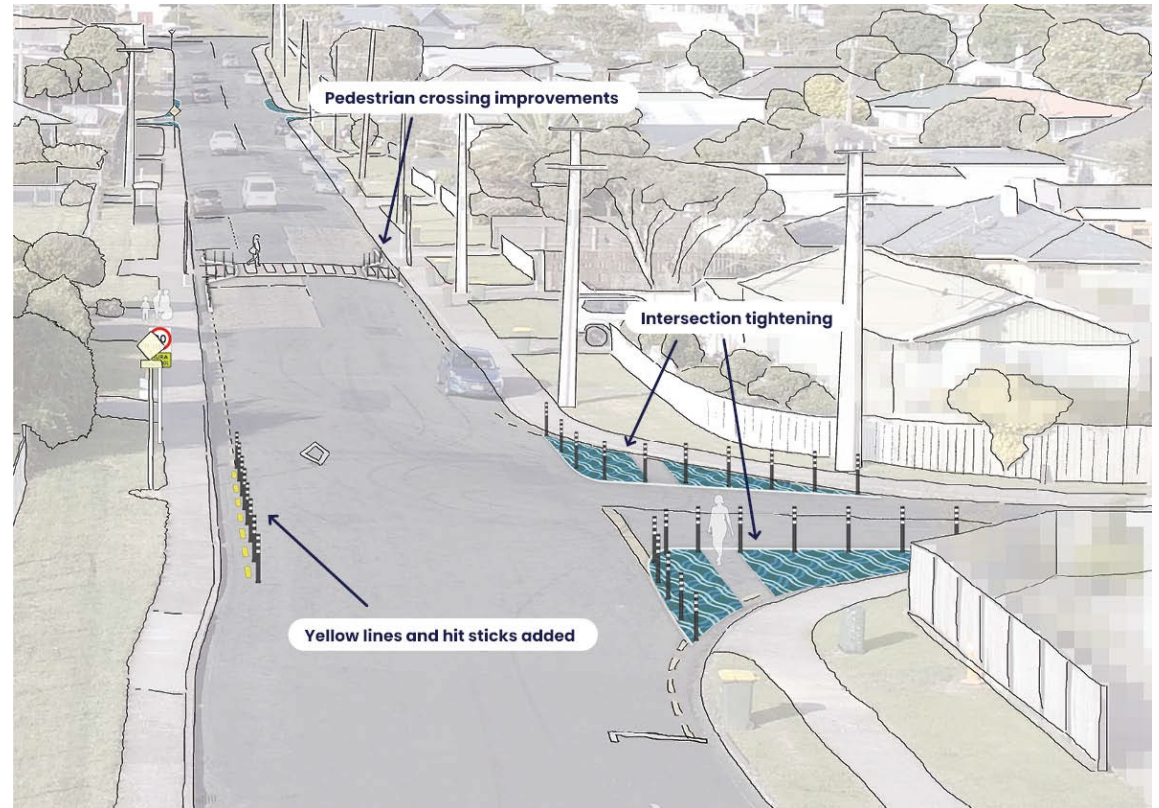
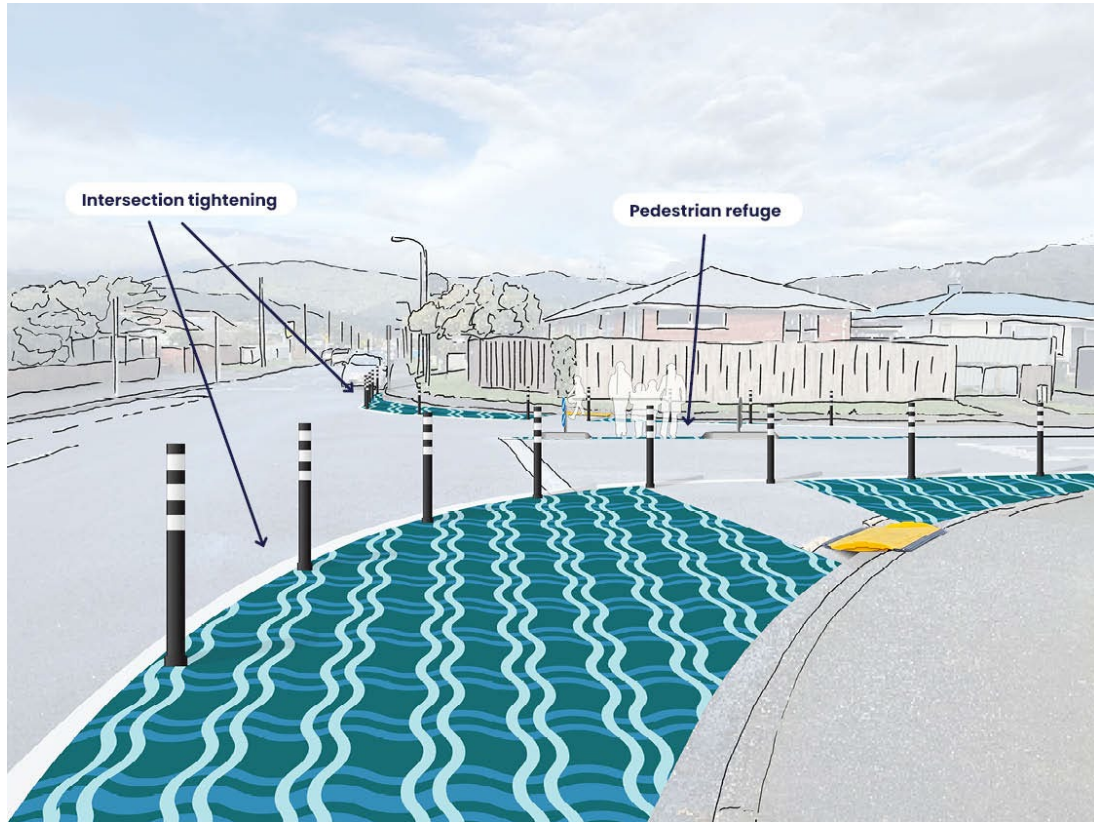
TE WHATA KAI O MĀUI – WAINUIOMATA

The abundance of food held within the store house of Māui reflects the abundance of Flora, Fauna which Wainuiomata is well known for.

In consultation with mana whenua, the designs used in the area are based on the “Te Whata Kai o Maui” narrative
