Request for Information – Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act (LGOIMA) 1987

We refer to your official information request dated 11 June 2024, asking:

- What is the current level of debt.
- What is the debt level capped at.
- How much does it cost in millions to service that debt over what timeline.

Answer:

We have interpreted your request to be asking about the debt held by Hutt City Council.

The current gross debt held by Hutt City Council is \$571.7 million. This figure reflects the level of borrowing undertaken to support the delivery of services and infrastructure across the city.

The Council's financial planning, as set out in the Long-Term Plan 2024–2034, includes a guideline that limits debt to no more than 2.5 times its annual revenue.

Based on current projections in the Annual Plan 2025–2026, debt is expected to reach a peak of \$1.1 billion over the next ten years, as part of a planned \$2.8 billion investment in city infrastructure and services. This level of borrowing remains within the Council's approved debt cap of \$1.2 billion.

At the projected peak debt level, the annual interest costs are estimated to average \$65 million per annum. These costs are factored into the Council's financial planning to ensure long-term sustainability and affordability.
