

Request for Information – Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act (LGOIMA) 1987

We refer to your official information request dated 18 March 2025:

- What services has the Hutt City Council increased in the last six years?
 When an increase in service is defined as a service that did not exist previously.
- 2. Have any existing services had their name changed in the last six years?
- 3. Have any existing named services increased in any way?
- 4. If existing named services have increased in some way in the last six years please explain what the increase has been.
- 5. Have any services been disestablished or reduced? If so, why?
- 6. If services have been disestablished what was the effect of this on the Council's expenditure, how were these services funded?
- 7. If a service was increased how was the increase funded? i.e rates, borrowing, user pays or other revenue
- 8. Was there any analysis done on subsidised fees after they were given e.g. subdivision consents, to determine the economic benefit to the City?
- 9. If so, was the value of the benefit higher than the loss of revenue?
- 10. Is independent economic analysis commissioned before subsidies are given?
- 11. Do the contributions gained under the Development Contributions policy cover the cost of the infrastructure that is a necessity due to a development?
