





Wellington Water

Wellington Water has advised that the Wainuiomata Water Treatment Plant will be temporarily switching off fluoride service next week to allow for maintenance work to be undertaken which is expected to take around a week to complete. The work will improve the accuracy of fluoride dosing control across all the plant's functions and systems. As well as letting us know Wellington Water has briefed Health New Zealand. Wainuiomata residents concerned about the temporary loss of fluoride service or seeking guidance on where to access fluoride tablets, should visit the Health New Zealand or New Zealand Dental Health Association websites. 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

RE: Community Water Fluoridation

Thank you for your letter of 3 November 2022 regarding the fluoridation of drinking water supplies for the suburbs of Petone and Korokoro in our City.

I advise that we have conferred with Wellington Water Limited (WWL), the CCO managing the delivery of 3 water services in Lower Hutt and our trusted advisors, who have provided us with the following information in respect of the matters you have raised.

I further advise that permitting the fluoridation of Petone and Korokoro has the additional benefit of allowing WWL to explore options to re-configure the Waterloo Water Treatment

Plant to provide Wainuiomata with fluoridated water in the peak weeks of summer. This will improve the public health outcomes for the Wainuiomata community.


