We refer to your official information request dated 28 July 2022, as follows:

I note that a report presented to the 24 May 2021 Long Term Plan sub-committee meeting proposed deferring \$3.5m capital expenditure for a retaining wall strengthening project on Eastern Hutt Road. The report stated that the risk of deferral is minimum and that such events are low probability in the order of 1 in 500 years. Given the events of last week, little more than a year after such advice was proffered to the Council, it is appropriate that you release the full risk assessment which arrived at such a rating.
