Tēnā koe Brad,

Request for Information – Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act (LGOIMA) 1987

We refer to your official information request dated 29 September 2025, seeking information about the Riverlink CBD Promenade development and its relationship to the 2030 Making Places vision. Specifically, you requested:

Now that Riverlink is confirmed, and the Pedestrian walk bridge to the station is also happening, I would like to know if there is any detail or otherwise on the Riverlink CBD Promenade development as depicted in the 2030 Making Places documents... I'm specifically trying to understand the following around what might be happening around the Dudley St area.

We have addressed each of your questions in the below.

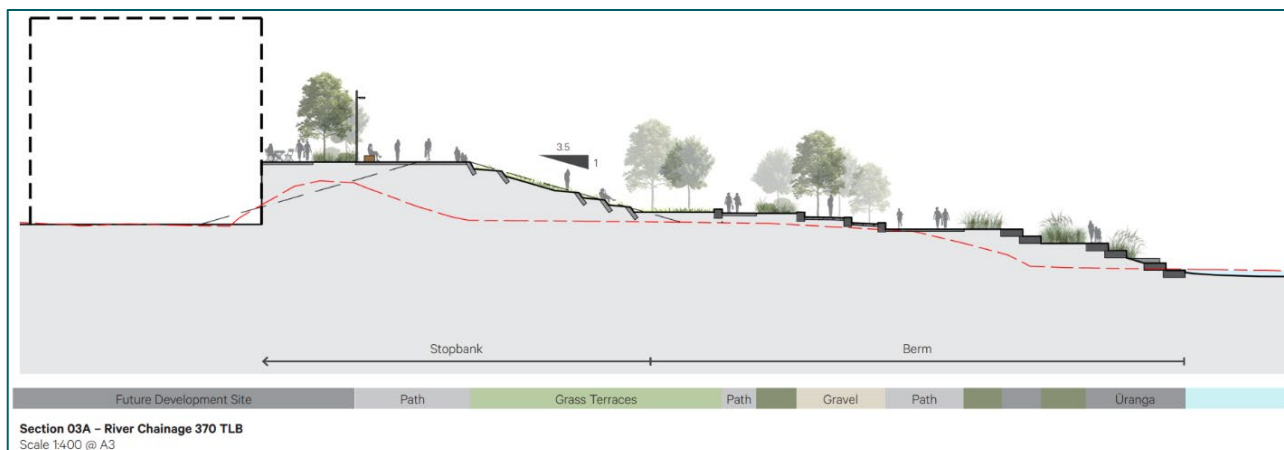
1. *Is Dudley St going to be widened to become 2 way?*

Answer: No, Council has no plan to widen Dudley Street.

2. *Will there be a raised promenade – with or without under parks – built up to the stop bank?*

Answer: Yes, the RiverLink programme includes a promenade along the crest of the stop bank that connects to adjoining buildings.

3. *Are there any plans around acquisition of the existing small commercial (or converted apartments) on the west side of Dudley St, between Margaret and St Andrews St?*

Answer: No, Council has no plan to acquire any property on Dudley Street.

4. *If these decisions/plans have not yet been made, is there any timeline as to when they can be expected?*

Answer: Plans for the promenade are still at an early stage. As there is no land acquisition or road widening proposed for Dudley Street, no decisions are currently being sought in relation to that area.
