Request for Information – Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act (the Act) 1987

We refer to your official information request dated 13 March 2024. We will answer each of your questions in turn.

- a. All information relevant to the Hutt City Council's removal of NZCPR's insert from Sir Āpirana Ngata's "The Treaty of Waitangi – an Explanation" from its premises including but not limited to:
- *i.* The number of inserts removed.

Response:

We did not record or tally how many inserts were removed.

We had previously understood there to be a small number (approximately 6-12) inserts removed.

Subsequently we have been advised that approximately 580 Hutt Newspapers are delivered to some council sites each week. On this basis we are unable to specify with certainty how many inserts were removed.
